Re: Massachusetts Public Records Request (Ref: EG8)

Dear Assistant District Attorney Hautanen,

This is a request under the Massachusetts Public Records Law (M. G. L. Chapter 66, Section 10).

I am requesting that I be provided with the name of the attorney who reviewed the files in the Benjamin LaGuer case (WOCR1983-03391), and for the name of the person who told you to call me, subsequent to a series of public records requests I sent on January 12, 2005 (Ref: EG1 – EG7). You referenced these people but refused to name the former in our conversation of 1/27/05. I am also requesting copies of any communications by paper, electronic or other media generated as part of this review, including with other agencies such as the Massachusetts District Attorneys Association.

I think you can appreciate that as your office is currently under Court order to preserve all documents associated with the LaGuer case (WOCR1983-03391 - P#144), the question of who is handling the file and in what manner is of significant public interest.

This request covers any and all oral communications, papers, emails, maps, photographs, recorded tapes, or other documentary materials or data, inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters by Worcester District Attorney John J. Conte, and or any employee under authority not limited to but to include employees assigned at 2 Main Street, Worcester MA, 332 Main Street Worcester MA and 19 Midstate Drive, Auburn MA.

As you are aware, I must be provided with this information within 10 days. If you cannot comply with this request (Ref: EG8), please provide an explanation in writing. I recognize that you may charge reasonable costs for photocopies, computer disks, or personnel time to comply with this request. If you expect charges to exceed \$10.00, please contact me with an explanation of those charges and how you arrived at them.
